## SPRING BRUSH CLEAN UP 2013

THE BOROUGH WILL BE PICKING UP BRUSH CURBSIDE APRIL 1 – 8

BRUSH CAN NOT EXCEED 5' IN LENGTH. BRUSH MUST BE 3" IN DIAMETER OR LESS. BRUSH MUST BE PLACED BUTT END TO THE CURB. SMALL STICKS MUST BE PLACED IN CONTAINERS. BRUSH ONLY - NO LEAVES, STONES OR OTHER DEBRIS, OR YOUR BRUSH WILL NOT BE PICKED UP.

BRUSH MAY NOT BE PLACED CURBSIDE PRIOR TO MARCH 30, 2013.

BRUSH PLACED OUT AFTER APRIL 8TH, 2013  
WILL NOT BE PICKED UP.



## Guide to Healthy Habits for Cleaner Water

Pollution on streets, parking lots and lawns is washed by rain into storm drains, then directly to our drinking water supplies and the ocean and lakes our children play in. Fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, pet waste, grass clippings: You name it and it ends up in our water. Stormwater pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean and plentiful water, and that's why we're all doing something about it. By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater. It all adds up to cleaner water, and it saves the high cost of cleaning up once it's dirty. As part of New Jersey's initiative to keep our water clean and plentiful and to meet federal requirements, many municipalities and other public agencies including colleges and military bases must adopt ordinances or other rules prohibiting various activities that contribute to stormwater pollution. Breaking these rules can result in fines or other penalties.

**\* Properly use and dispose of Hazardous products \***

**\* Limit your use of fertilizers and pesticides \***

**\* Clean up after your pet \***

**\* Dispose of yard waste properly \***

**\* Don't litter \***
